#### WE ARE APPROACHING 17,000 DONATED BICYCLES!

Bikes For Kids had another successful year. We gave away 1,368 bikes and new helmets during 2013 which averages out to roughly 3-4 per day. At our present rate, we are able to donate 1,000+ bikes every nine months to groups and individuals who would most likely not be able to otherwise own one. We will come close to matching the 2013 total by December 31, 2014 and has donated a grand total of 16.700 since 1989!



#### We Now Have a New Wheelhouse in Old Saybrook:

Thanks to a wonderful offer from Bill Pappas, Bikes For Kids was able, for the first time, to move all of its bikes under one roof in a very suitable facility in Old Saybrook. The "Wheelhouse" now contains almost 600 bikes, most of which are ready for donation and provides plenty of space for 5-6 repair stands. The efficiency of such a place for us is unsurpassed because we no longer have to store bikes in seven sheds, in three towns, or climb over several to get to the ones we need. Bill has covered the lease for us on the Wheelhouse for three years; something that Bikes For Kids would not have been able to do for many years to come. We are saddened to report that our Vice President, Gary Baier passed away on October 17, 2014. Gary was instrumental in moving our organization toward a 501(c)3 status several years ago and was always ready to help wherever he could in any capacity. We valued Gary's input several times during his time with our organization. We also appreciated his suggestions of possible avenues to pursue as BFK grew and increased its reach to young people in need. Gary was married to his wife, Jen for 30 years and had three daughters, Rachel, Wendy and Jennifer. He was a graduate of Worchester Polytechnic Institute in 1982 and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in 1988 with degrees in Mechanical Engineering. More recently Gary was a Physics teacher at the Morgan School in Clinton for 7 years. Prior to that he had spent 25 years in the automotive and aerospace industries, working for The Lee Co. and Laminova. He also owned Best Engineering and held a U.S. patent. Gary was a competitive shooter at the Niantic Sportsmen's Club in Niantic and could often be found sailing his boat on Long Island Sound. We will miss Gary greatly as the weeks and months go on.

### BIKES FOR HARTFORD: Four Adventurers Cycle from the Tip of Cape Cod to Hartford...

Back in the spring, we were contacted by four bike enthusiasts wanting to do a charity ride to help provide funding and bicycles to the young people of Hartford. Andy Meigs, Chris Rago, and brothers Tim and Patrick Scully had planned a marathon ride of 207 miles from Provincetown, MA to Hartford in one day. Leaving at 1:00 a.m., they rode along the Cape Cod Rail Trail and then rode the main routes once the sun came up through Providence & the steep hills of Eastern CT. Finally they arrived, exhausted, but happy, at the Soldiers and Sailors Monument in Bushnell Park at about 8:30 that evening where they were greeted by family, friends and members of Bikes For Kids. Prior to this "double century" ride, the four men sponsored a bike collection for BFK- about 100 bikes! They were later repaired, safety-checked and distributed among four Boys' and Girls' Clubs in the Hartford area. A huge thank you goes out to Chris, Andrew, Patrick and Tim for their herculean efforts along with their volunteers that provided support assistance.

#### 50 Kids...An Experience to Remember!

Bikes For Kids teamed up with Jack Kasten from the Connecticut Tigers & Claudia Mitchell from Norwich DCF to bring smiles and bikes to 50 Norwich and New London kids. The recipients and their families were treated to tickets and food vouchers. A \$1000 grant was provided by Pfizer to help offset a portion of the cost. **Bikes to Tanzania:** We received a request for 45 mountain bikes from *Artists For World Peace*. This Middletown based group has supported the village of Kibosho in Tanzania each summer for the last several years. This year, AFWP sent eye doctors and surgical equipment over to perform exams and minor surgical procedures. As a result of our bicycles arriving at the village, the women no longer have to walk the several miles down a dusty dirt road to a mill with maize to be ground, or make the long walk back. They now can use bikes to get to and from the mill, the riverfront and other outlying areas, in a much more reasonable amount of time. Our bikes have improved the quality of life there by shortening the amount of time it normally took to perform essential tasks.





On January 20, our civil engineer volunteer friends from Milone and MacBroom helped repair dozens of bicycles at the Essex Fire Department and load, transport, & set up 20+ storage racks donated by BLR, Inc. at the Wheelhouse.
